

## **STATEMENT OF ECONOMIC INTERESTS (FORM 700)**

### **Who Must File**

State law (the Political Reform Act of 1974) requires candidates for school and special districts to disclose their interests in real property and income within the past 12 months in a Statement of Economic Interests (Form 700) to be filed within 30 days of assuming office and candidates appointed to an office file 10 days after assuming office. (Gov.Code 87200, et.seq.)

Candidates for city council are required to file a Statement of Economic Interests (Form 700) with their Declaration of Candidacy.

Report investments, interests in real property, and business positions held on the date of filing the Declaration of Candidacy. In addition, report income (including loans, gifts, and travel payments) received during the 12 months prior to the date of filing the Declaration of Candidacy.

**EXCEPTION:** This statement is not required of a candidate who has filed a statement for the same jurisdiction as an officeholder within sixty (60) days prior to assuming office or filing the Declaration of Candidacy. (Gov.Code 87201, 87202)

See Form 700 for instructions and information on the jurisdiction which determines what must be disclosed for each office.

Statements of Economic Interests are a public record. They may be inspected by anyone and copies may be purchased from the filing officer for ten cents per page. (Gov.Code 81008)
