Dr. Svetlana Broz – Tito’s granddaughter – to speak in Monterey

MONTEREY, Calif. – The Monterey Institute of International Studies and the City of Monterey will host a lecture by Dr. Svetlana Broz on the topic of “*Ethnicity and Nation-Building: Lessons from the Balkans.*” The free public lecture will be held on Wednesday, October 24 from 7:00 – 9:00 p.m. in the Irvine auditorium in the McCone building at the Monterey Institute for International Studies, 499 Pierce St., Monterey.

Dr. Svetlana Broz is the granddaughter of Josip Broz Tito, the second President of the Socialist Federal Republic of Yugoslavia (1953-1980). Dr. Broz has dedicated her career to combating the nationalism that has plagued current-day Bosnia and Herzegovina, and actively participates in humanitarian restoration efforts. Dr. Broz holds membership in various non-governmental agencies, and in 2001 became Board President for the First Children's Embassy in the World. She also is an acclaimed lecturer, author, and cardiologist.

Since publication of *Having What It Takes: Essays on Civil Courage* (Gariwo, Sarajevo, 2006), Dr. Broz has been on a world-wide lecture tour, which includes the Monterey Institute of International Studies. This lecture also is sponsored by the Monterey Bay Chapter of the United Nations Association of the USA, Global Majority, the Monterey Institute of International Studies’ on-campus Amnesty International, United Nations, and Conflict Resolution clubs.

The Monterey Institute of International Studies, an affiliate of Middlebury College, is a private graduate institution located in Monterey, Calif.
